Description	<p>In this interactive workshop children will gain an understanding of what everyday life was like for families living in rural England in the 1930s.</p> <p>They will explore the differences between the lives of people living in two very different homes within the model village.</p> <p>With a focus on the home and food and drink, this workshop uses story telling and role play to learn about life in the early part of the century.</p>
