Duration	30 minutes
Description	<p>In this interactive workshop children will take a trip back in time to better understand how long ago Bekonscot was built.</p> <p>With lots of pupil participation the “Time Machine” takes the children on a step by step journey back through the times that they were born as well as their parents, grandparents and great grandparents. Role play and images of the times will help the children to understand how long ago the 1930s were and therefore give a better understanding of what they are seeing in the Model Village.</p>
