Title	Transport
Age group	KS1
Duration	45 minutes
Description	<p>In this workshop children will identify the different forms of transport available in 1930s. They will gain an understanding of how improved access to transport changed the lives of people and communities during this period of time.</p> <p>With a focus on planes, trains and automobiles children will use their own experiences to compare the distances travelled, the experience and the safety of these forms of transport in 1930 compared to today.</p>
National Curriculum	<p>Develop an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time</p> <p>Know where the people and events they study fit within a chronological framework and identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods.</p> <p>Understand significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.</p> <p>Understand the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements.</p>
